**Pathway Advising Notes:** This plan is designed for students with a transferable AA or AS who are transferring to Carroll College to pursue a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Sociology (Broadfield, Criminology, or Medical and Human Services). Students with a transferrable AA or AS will have fulfilled Carroll's core requirements except for Introduction to Theology (TH 101) and one philosophy course if a philosophy course was not taken during the AA/AS degree.

By taking the required courses in years 1 and 2 and by transferring the maximum 62 semester / 93 quarter credits, this plan allows the student to complete the Sociology undergraduate degree in two years at Carroll.

**Career Info:** Sociologists are employed by research institutes, the criminal justice system, public health and welfare organizations, private businesses, law firms, international agencies, medical centers, educational institutions, advertising firms, survey and polling organizations, and beyond. Students with a bachelor's degree in sociology often secure employment as social researchers, case workers, paralegals, public relations workers, administrators, community organizers, public policy researchers, and data analysts. Sociology also provides great preparation for going on to law school, medical school, business school, and for graduate degree programs in social work, education, public policy, religious ministry, mass communications, public health, non-profit administration, and international affairs.
