MSU Bozeman's Sociology program has a 6 credit lower-division elective maximum. Student transferring in as SOCI generalists can choose between SOCI 160, 211, and 221 in the Fall semester as one of their two lower division elective courses. Students transferring in with a criminology emphasis should take 211 as this equivalent to SOCI 311 and will not count towards the lower-division elective maximum.

If student has reached SOCI lower division elective maximum, student is advised to continue taking courses in SOCI to gain more knowledge but can also take courses in other departments per student interest, 200 level courses advised.
