Pathway Advising Notes: Transfer agreement established - junior standing so long as they meet the requirements of this agreement. Courses must have a grade of C- or higher in order to be utilized in the transfer agreement.

Career Info: Sociologists are employed by research institutes, the criminal justice system, public health and welfare organizations, private businesses, law firms, international agencies, medical centers, educational institutions, advertising firms, survey and polling organizations, and beyond. Students with a bachelor's degree in sociology often secure employment as social researchers, case workers, paralegals, public relations workers, administrators, community organizers, public policy researchers, and data analysts. Sociology also provides great preparation for going on to law school, medical school, business school, and for graduate degree programs in social work, education, public policy, religious ministry, mass communications, public health, non-profit administration, and international affairs.

SOCI221: HC students may apply up to 4 HC SOCI courses to SOCI major at UM. SOCI elective options in the Fall are SOCI 160, 211, and 221. If student has fulfilled elective units - advised to take any 200 level course in area of interest.

SOCI201: HC students may apply up to 4 HC SOCI courses to SOCI major at UM. SOCI elective options in the Spring are SOCI 201, 220, and 234. 220 and 234 are Diversity. If student has fulfilled elective units - advised to take any 200 level course in area of interest.
