Fire & Emergency Services Pathway review.

- See attached curriculum map
 - -First group of new curriculum restructure is graduating this spring
 - -Fire Fighter one (FIRE 101) and Fire Fighter two (FIRE 102) are now broke out into the two classes. The outcomes are aligned with the certification process, which is a hands on process. They both align with IFSAC Pro Board certification, the MFPA 1001 standards and the fascia objectives. This is very useful for assessment.
 - -Paramedic Pre-Reg are built in.
 - -EMT course is NOT required for FES, but recommended. Some can't pass the EMT course, it was making it so people couldn't complete degree.
 - -Fire Prevention, Building Construction, and Fire Protections Systems is stream as well as in person

o 23-24 Changes

- -Internship is pulled out of 1st semester as it is tough to get through the background checks in a timely manner. Allow 1-3 semesters of Internship for credit (prev. 2-3)
- -Capstone is paired down to a fire service research project and mock interviews



- -Medical Terminology will be offered next year online (last piece of EMT)
- -Suggestion: Mental health first aid instead of abnormal psyc
 - -Clarified Gen Ed Options
 - -Updated FIRE 299 Capstone to focus on Research Project and Interview Boards
- Equipment and facilities update
 - 2005 American LaFrance Pumper
 - Converted to Air Primer
 - Pump and valve repairs
 Eventually we will need to replace- have put \$10,000 into it recently
 - 2008 Ford F-550 Brush Truck
 Is laid out in DNRC style
 - Training House
 - Behind airport fence and lacks basement for current FF1
 -HC is working with Helena Fire Dept to help with upkeep. Tough to build due to airport flight path
 - SCBA
 - Leasing Issues -only 2 vendors in N. America... about \$700 per year per apparatus. Long term is more expensive to lease, but keeps it so that we do not have to pay a large amount at one point in time.
 - -Did get some donated, but need parts that are hard to find.
 - Live Fire Options we are leasing for burn trailer
 - New Equipment
 - Rope rescue gear updated (about 2/3 of it...rest updated next year)
- Discuss work-based learning opportunities for students.
 - o FIRE 298 Internship
 - -Is VERY valuable experience, tough because smaller departments don't get as many calls.
 - -Maybe seasonal experience with Forest Service or DNRC
- Discuss Articulation/Transfer opportunities
 - UM Western BS in Business Administration and minor in Fire and Emergency Services – still in works, but moving forward and are hoping to have it set up by end of this year.
 - o Paramedic Programs
- General Discussion
 - -Frenchtown 3 years program. Students start at Frenchtown one year before they start at HC. The first year is driver school, EMT, and wildland. Paramedic is very



valuable...working on getting it up and running. The 1^{st} year helps with retention. The department does a tuition reimbursement AFTER completion of degree at HC .

- -If students already come in with a lot of Gen ed credit...may be able to complete all fire courses in 1 year.
- -MSU fire services training school tests our students for all of their certifications and all around the state of Montana. Is very flexible to work around school class schedules and with the fire departments around the state.
- -EMT students and clinicals are working really smoothly at St. Peters.
