

1. Enter “**Activity Name**” (for example, “Self-Introduction Video Assignment”)
2. Fill in the “**Activity description**”.

5. Enter your grade settings if you want this activity to be graded.
6. Fill in these settings if needed.
7. Click on “**Save and return to course**”.

(4) If it's your first time using ScreenPal on Moodle, you'll see a box like this to request you to sign into your ScreenPal account on Moodle:



(5) Once you're logged in you'll be shown a list of your current uploads at <https://screenpal.com/HelenaCollegeOnline> so you can easily click to embed a video.


There are three options you can choose depending on your choice of activity:

Note:


There has to be at least one recording uploaded in your channel in order for your channel to be visible here.



1. You can choose a **video** to embed in Moodle or click the “New Recording” button to launch the recorder from your browser to create a new recording.



2. You can also embed an entire video channel for student assignments. Under the “**Channel**” tab, select a channel to include. Click embed channel. When your students access to this activity, the video channel will be available for viewing.



3. You can also embed the screen recorder for student assignments. To add the recorder, go to the “**Recorder**” Tab and select the channel where you want student videos uploaded. Click embed. Students can now access this activity and create their own videos for an assignment. The videos they create will be uploaded automatically to your selected channel.

For this option, students won't be able to see each other's video submissions (good for mid-term/final exam, etc).

If you do want students to be able to see each other's video submissions (good for group projects or peer review assignments, etc), then please ignore the Option 3 instructions from above and read the following instructions instead:
