Course Advising Notes:

M121: Offered online fall, spring, and summer.

1 of ASTR110, BIOH104, GEO101: Natural Science with lab, courses shown are recommended and regularly offered online. ASTR 110 always offered online in the summer semester. Any other 4-credit transferrable science can be used.

BGEN105: Required for UM transfer articulation

ACTG101: Course is a pre-requisite for ACTG 201, but not necessarily required for this degree. If students have accounting experience and understand the accounting equation and debits and credits, they can go right into ACTG 201 with instructor approval. Students will still earn 60 credits needed for degree if this course is not taken if students take 3 4-credit science courses as recommended.

ECNS201 or ECNS202: Both courses offered in rotation fall, spring, and summer semesters in online format. Required for UM transfer articulation.

BGEN220: Recommended course for UM transfer articulation. Meets H&FA degree requirement.

COMX111: COMX 111 recommended, meets Communication requirement at HC and Expressive Arts (A) requirement at UM. Course offered fall, spring, and summer semester.

BMIS270: Required for UM transfer articulation.

BGEN235: Required for UM transfer articulation.

ACTG201: ACTG 102 Pre-requisite waived for AS Business students. Required for UM transfer articulation.

ECNS201 or ECNS202: Both courses offered in rotation fall, spring, and summer semesters in online format. Required for UM transfer articulation.

1 of ARTZ101, MART145, PHL110, SPNS101: Recommended courses shown are offered online. If student wants greater alignment with the UM core, LIT 110 is both a H&FA and an intermediate writing requirement at UM and may be offered in a virtual format.

1 of ANTY101, HSTA101, PSYX100, SOCI101: Social & Psychological Science/History recommended courses offered online. Any S&PS/H course will meet this requirement.

NASX105: Diversity and Cultural Heritage of American Indians. Course offered online fall, spring, and summer semesters.

STAT216: Highly recommended for UM transfer articulation. Course offered online fall and spring semesters.

CSCI172: Currently required for articulation agreement.
